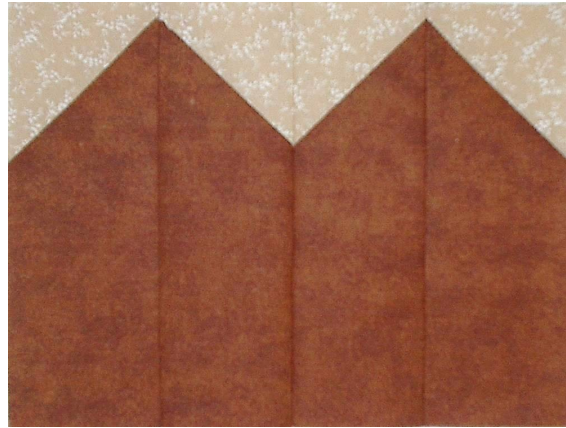


Old Picket Fences!

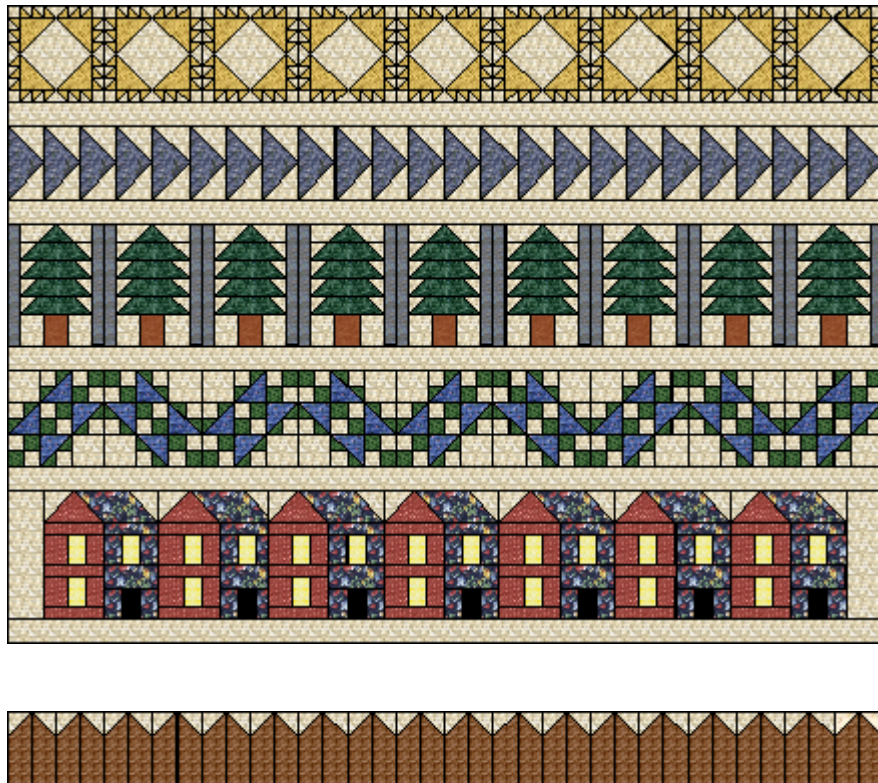


6 1/2 " by 8 1/2" *Finished* Block

Please remember to read *all instructions* before making the block!

Instructions given are for a single block

There are 9 "Picket Fences " blocks in this quilt



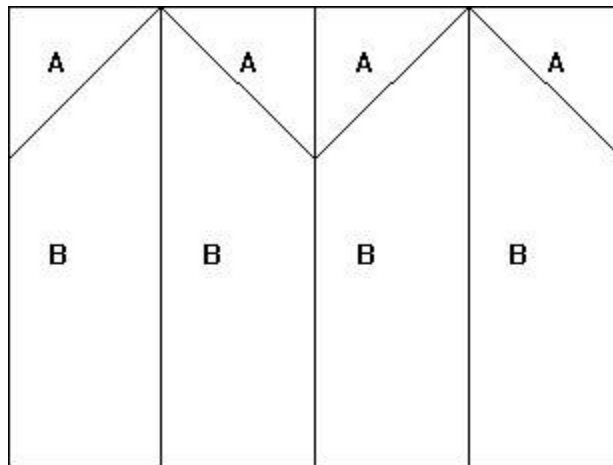
For all 9 Old Picket Fences Blocks in this Quilt:

You will need:

**2/3 yard of brown fabric for
"old" fence posts**

1/4 yard of background fabric

Instructions for one block



Picket Fences

6 1/2" by 8 1/2" finished block

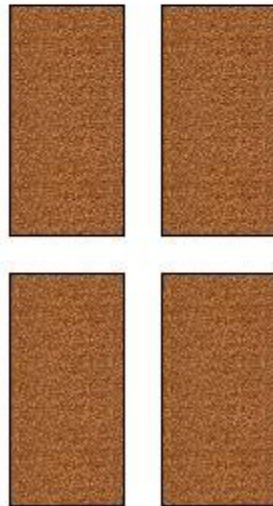
**Cut 4....2 1/2" squares
from your background
fabric**



On the wrong side of fabric draw a diagonal line through the center of each block, This will be your sewing line.



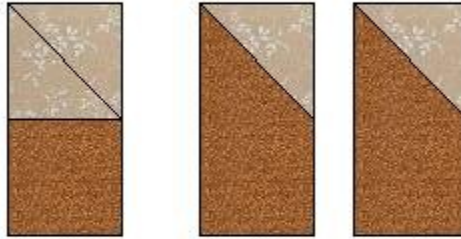
Cut 4... 2 1/2" wide by 6 1/2 inch long rectangles from your brown fabric



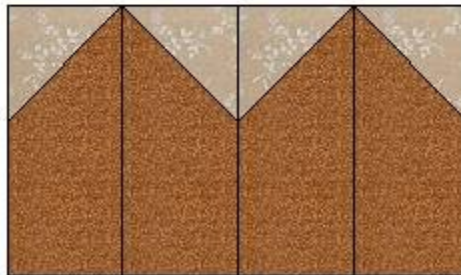
Using your drawn line as a sewing line, with right sides together sew the 2 1/2" square to the 2 1/2" by 6 1/2" rectangle. Trim a 1/4" seam and press. Make 2



Alternate sides and repeat sewing 2 more



Sew them all together and you have some fence blocks!
